Wednesday Year 10 – BRONZE Assessed

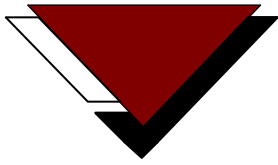
All students from this group **MUST** attend on Wednesday 17th, to collect their expedition equipment in preparation for the weekend.

A reminder to students that we have exam pencil cases for sale in the library for £1.50 containing everything you need.

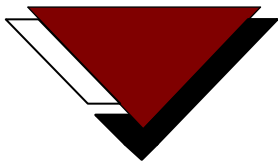

Year 11 Computing Revision Sessions

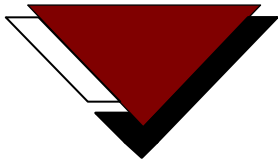
Year 11 GCSE Computing revision sessions will be held on Mondays and Wednesdays after school from 3.30-4.30pm. The following topics will be covered:
