

## Teacher of PE Information Booklet May 2018



## **Introduction**

Thank you for enquiring about our **Teacher of PE** position. We hope after reading the information in this pack, you will be excited by the prospect of joining our team and will submit your application for this post.

Vandyke is a good place to work, with high expectations and a caring ethos. "Everyone Matters" here at Vandyke and our Annual Survey consistently shows that staff feel well supported, are supportive of one another and that students enjoy coming to school. We often find that competition for posts at Vandyke is strong and the experience colleagues gain here can be a stepping stone to further promotion.

## **The Role**

Thank you for enquiring about our position of Teacher of PE.

As a former Specialist Sports College, PE and Sport along with Dance remain particularly important parts of our curriculum and of students' experience of their time here. We are a recognised training school by the University of Bedfordshire and every year train Year1 through to Year 4 students here. We continue to host the local Sports Partnership, recognised nationally for its work in leading sports and PE development in our cluster of 28 schools. The partnership employs a full-time manager and part-time team and this work brings many staff and pupils from our partner schools here. For example, currently the local hockey development officer has been based with us. We employ a PE apprentice and a dedicated PE cover supervisor.

Vandyke is a school with high expectations and a caring ethos. We believe that "Everyone Matters". The school has a 'special atmosphere' - one that visitors often comment upon. This special atmosphere is based on our emphasis on high quality relationships: staff-to-staff, student-to-student and staff-to-student. Feedback from staff is clear that it is a great place to work.

The successful candidate will be joining a thriving school, with a growing reputation for excellent teaching and achievement, innovative and inclusive practice, and excellent leadership and management that puts students and learning at the centre. The school was rated by OFSTED as "good" in March 2015; we believe the school provides an excellent education for our students.

## ***The Role***

The PE team comprises five full-time teachers and a dedicated Cover Supervisor who supports PE together with our PE apprentice.

The PE team currently runs GCSE PE at KS4 and a range of BTEC Sport courses at KS5. In the recent past we offered A Level PE and KS4 BTEC Sport also and the curriculum mix is kept under constant review to ensure opportunities that maximize

engagement and achievement. We have introduced additionally for September 2018 the OCR Sports Science course.

Uptake for PE/Sport-related courses at GCSE and in the Sixth Form is high. Students have five hours of teaching per fortnight for GCSE PE and we currently have four classes of GCSE per year group.

Facilities are outstanding with a full-size astro-turf pitch, sports hall, activity hall and dance studio among the dedicated spaces. The team has three dedicated classrooms, two with computers, each with digital projectors and all staff have their own laptop.

The ethos of the team is extremely positive, with a proven track record of very strong outcomes. We are aspirational, dedicated and innovative in our shared practice. Students at our school value their PE lessons and performance in PE exceeds national expectations. We continually strive to achieve at the highest level. To this end, planning together and sharing resources is very important to us and contributes to our success.

The whole school is covered by a wireless network, which enables all teachers to use their school provided laptops in any classroom and allows students to use their own laptops and wifi-enabled devices where this is appropriate within the curriculum. Every student and member of staff has their own e-mail account and full access to the internet and intranet.

The successful candidate will need to be flexible, show initiative and be willing to learn any new skills required to support the ever-changing needs of a modern, rigorous and challenging PE and Sport curriculum. You will be joining a highly successful team that provides a great deal of support including training and career development opportunities.

## The School



Our students achieve very well, making strong progress in all year groups and achieving good outcomes at GCSE and A Level. In 2016 and in 2017 GCSE outcomes were at the national average with students arriving here below the average. EBacc outcomes are especially strong emphasising the school's focus on the humanities and modern foreign languages. GCSE PE results were good.

At A level outcomes are excellent. Along with all central Bedfordshire schools we use ALPs to monitor progress. A Level outcomes are ALPS 3 in 2017 and a 3-year ALPs 3 also demonstrating the very strong progress made by students in their time in the Vandyke Sixth Form. BTEC outcomes in year12/13 are ALPs 2.

The ethos of Vandyke is based on strong, positive relationships between staff and students. The atmosphere is a "college" one whereby we seek to allow students autonomy and independence. Students respond very well to this creating a "special" atmosphere around school. Staff enjoy working here and go out of their way to provide great teaching and additional learning opportunities for students. Parents are supportive of the school and feedback from parents is always that the school is welcoming and friendly.

On 10/11 March 2015, we had an Ofsted inspection that judged Vandyke overall to be a “good” school. The report states “students are very proud of their academy. They behave well and display highly constructive attitudes to their learning.”

Vandyke is a Challenge Partners School. The February 2018 Quality Audit Review judged the school to be “good” and identified English in particular as an area of excellence. Our commitment to high standards and to regularly reviewing, evaluating and improving our practices is recognised in the many awards we hold. We are proud to hold Sportsmark and Artsmark Gold awards, in recognition of our commitment to Sport/PE and our outstanding programme of extra-curricular sport and performing arts activities. We also hold the International School Award, which recognises the depth and breadth of our commitment to the international dimension of our curriculum. We have just joined PiXL (Partners in Excellence) which marks a further exciting development. PiXL provides professional development opportunities for staff.



Facilities at Vandyke are excellent and include refurbished and developed areas such as a Theatre, Drama Studio, Dance Studio, Sports Hall, Sports Activity area, Music suite, Café, and Library/Study facilities.

As a successful and popular school, Vandyke was by Central Beds local authority to expand to accommodate additional students. This expansion has added a further 10 new classrooms and PE rooms increasing capacity to 1200 students. With growth planned nearby, a further programme to new Sixth Form centre and 12 new Science Labs is also planned and will bring the number on roll to 1500.
